

Press statement

Peter Bruce, chair of the Caterers Offshore Trade Association, said: "We are pleased that RMT members have voted no to strike action although we recognised they voted yes to industrial action short of a strike.

"Across the Unite and RMT ballots only 290 employees (9%) voted in favour of taking part in strike action out of a total workforce of over 3000.

"We believe that the majority of our workforce are acutely aware of the economic situation in which we now find ourselves and understand that a pay freeze is not only fair but is also vital in ensuring the future of our industry.

"We look forward to meaningful discussions with the unions on Monday 2 November and hope that we can find a resolution which will be of benefit to all parties. There can be no winners from strike action."
